

CHARLOTTE ISD SCHOOLS WILL REOPEN ON SEPTEMBER 8, 2020. FAMILIES WILL HAVE TWO OPTIONS FOR LEARNING:

1.ON-CAMPUS 2.REMOTE INSTRUCTION

PLANS WILL BE IN PLACE TO QUICKLY PIVOT FROM ON-CAMPUS TO REMOTE INSTRUCTION IF A STUDENT NEEDS TO REMAIN AT HOME DUE TO QUARANTINE OR ILLNESS OR IF THE SCHOOL IS TEMPORARILY CLOSED.

ON-CAMPUS INSTRUCTION

- Traditional on-campus instruction with access to 1:1 Chromebooks
- Daily health screening for students/staff
- New social distancing procedures
- Heightened cleaning & sanitation procedures
- Limited outside visitors
- Masks required when transitioning between classes, when working in small groups, and when social distancing is not possible
- Should it be necessary to close school buildings to the public again for any reason, all students would immediately pivot to remote instruction.
- Eligible for extracurricular activities

Remote instruction in 2020-2021 will be significantly more rigorous and require a substantial commitment of time each day.

REMOTE INSTRUCTION

- CISD Chromebook (Pre-K 12th) provided
- Daily attendance required through online interaction
- Quality curriculum with high expectations
- Independent work required
- Online/phone interaction with teachers
- Option to transition to on-campus instruction two weeks prior to the end of the 9 week grading period
- High School CTE Classes may require some in person instruction
- Not eligible for extracurricular activities
- CISD will schedule a required device pickup prior to September 8
- Pre-K thru 5th grade will be required to meet a minimum of 180 minutes per day (3 hrs)
- 6th 12th grade will be required to meet a minimum of 240 minutes per day (4 hrs)

In planning for our schools reopening, Charlotte ISD is committed to providing our students with a quality education while prioritizing the health and safety of our students, staff, and community. CISD Plans are guided by recommendations from the Texas Education Agency, Texas Department of State Health Services, and local health officials and are subject to change.
